New to The Market Beef Project?

The new 4-H year has arrived, and with the new year comes new projects! Selecting your next market steer is both an exciting and serious time. If this year will be your first year in the market steer project and you are starting the process of selecting your animal, think about the following questions suggested during the 2020 Junior Beef Producer Day. Ask yourself: When/where is your terminal endpoint? Have you ever fed a market animal out? What is your level of nutrition knowledge? How well do you understand an animal's growth curve and proper nutritional needs? What is your resource availability? What do you hope to take from the project? At what level do you plan/hope to compete? Asking yourself these questions will set the pace for where you need to begin your research so that you are able to care for your project in the best possible way. Asking others these questions if you do not know the answer is another great way to learn about the project process. Always be sure to ask questions when you need help with your project. Proper care and nutrition are the basis for the market steer project and when you understand how to do them properly, then you will be successful in the market beef project.

4-H Council Meeting

It was decided at the November Meeting to hold 4-H council Meetings on the 4th Monday of the odd months at 6:15 PM.

The next Council Meeting is scheduled for Jan 24th at 6:15 PM and will meet at the community building.

Tagging and Weigh In

We will be using EID tags for all livestock animals in 2022 again. This year each 4-Her will be responsible for paying for their tags and they will cost \$3.25 each. Beef tagging deadline will be March 30th and the small animal weigh-in and tagging will be from 9am-12pm on April 23rd at the Chase County Fairgrounds. Tags for beef will be available starting March 1st for pick up in the Extension Office in Cottonwood Falls.

Fair 2022

The Fair Board voted to allow market goats to sell in the Livestock Premium Sale for the 2022 Fair. Members will still be limited to selling one animal per specie through the premium sale. Extra animals who have made weight can be sold to the floor buyer if they wish. All market animals must be tagged with a 4-H elD tag by the 4-H tagging deadlines.

Project Changes

There have been some project changes at the State level. The fair book is being revised to update and include these project changes. Be sure to look over the complete project list when selecting projects for the 4-H year and look for updates in next year's fair book
