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4-H Enrollment

It is almost time to enroll for 4-H again! It is the same process as last year. You must enroll via 4-H Online, version 2. The link is https://v2.4honline.com/. New enrollments and re-enrollments begin October 1 and need to be completed by November 1. For the new 4-H families, brochures will be available from the Club Leaders, the Extension Office, and you can also find them on our website at http://www.flinthills.k-state.edu/4-h/. Please let us know if you have any questions. You can call our offices. Just a reminder that there is a \$15 enrollment fee.

Families should review years in project as they make project selections. This is the one feature that did not carry over from version one.

Any Adult Who Wants to Volunteer

- Every community and project leader (Club and/or County) needs to have completed the volunteer screening process. You will need to update, or start a profile in 4-H Online if you haven't already done so. Once you update your profile it will automatically renew your VIP status every year. There is no longer a need to fill out the renewal form.
- The State is still requiring you to re-screen every 3 years after your initial year. You will complete the form online via 4-H Online--no more paper copies. We will submit the National Criminal Background Check for you as long as you have completed the Validity check in the past. A second background check is not required.
- You will only be required to complete the Orientation Training and Agent Interview if you have not completed the volunteer screening in the past.
 You will also need to complete the CBC (Validity) background check if you have not completed it in the past. The link will be provided to you.
- One other major change is that 'episodic' volunteers have been changed to 'Adult Helpers' instead. Now it is more defined, so hopefully it won't be as confusing as it was before.

The volunteer renewal process will begin October 1 along with 4-H enrollment and re-enrollment. If you completed it last year, it should remain as your permanent record in 4-H Online. It will just need to be edited each year going forward. You will receive an e-mail or letter if you need to complete anything other than updating the profile. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer please reach out to the extension office for details

2022 4-H Camp at Rock Springs Ranch

Families should have a paper mailer from the State 4-H office with an update regarding camp next year. Sign up for 2022 will use the link: camp https://www.rockspringsranch4hcamp.org/. Early registration for 4-H families will open September 1, and this website will be the hub for all 4-H camp information. They are offering a tiered pricing model for families to select from. A 10% early bird 4-H discount will be offered and run through October 31. At the time of registration, campers will be required to make a 10% deposit, with the rest paid in full by May 1. They have developed multiple options for payment of camp fees this year including a monthly payment option with credit card or E-Check or pay in full by May 1st.

Camp options will be available for all 4-H members who will be going into 3rd-12th grade for the school year following the camp season. The menu of sessions will include 10 options to be offered June 8-July 23. Flint Hills District has targeted Session #4: June 19-22 for attendance. Agent(s) will plan to attend camp during these dates and encourage any Flint Hills District 4-H members to attend during this session. If these dates won't work for your family, choose another session that works better for you, if you wish.

All youth must be chaperoned by parent or 4-H leader. County groups will be housed in the same cottage and all dogs must be on leash or kenneled in your room. Owners must pick up and bag after dogs.

Please note that dogs must be current with all 4-H-required vaccinations in order to participate in the Kansas 4-H Dog Care and Training Project. This includes the Kansas 4-H Dog Conference, Check with your family veterinarian to make sure your dog is up to date with its vaccinations.

Agent's Tip of the Month



Happy New 4-H year!

October 1 - September 30 are the dates of the 4-H year each year. With the new year, families must log in to 4-H Online to update their enrollment for the 4-H year. This includes choosing the projects for the year. If you haven't looked, check out the project selection guide to give you some new ideas on possible projects. You can add or drop projects until May 1. When you are choosing your projects, please take the time to make sure the years in the project is correct. Some of these did not carry over the new system last year. It is helpful if parents have taken a quick look to confirm that those numbers are correct.

Reports of enrollment are run in our offices at the beginning of November so project leaders have a list of members enrolled in the project and club leaders have lists of members. It is important for enrollments to be completed by November 1.

As you have just completed record books, take a few moments to write your goals for your projects for next year. This could be on a piece of paper or on your project report form document. Determine your tracking method for recording 4-H events and activities - this might be on a calendar, a list, or with your 4-H program. Organize your thoughts now to help you track the year's activities.

Roasting Pumpkin Seeds



It's spooky season! Time to bring out the Halloween costumes and use pumpkins as decoration for the front porch. As you are carving and decorating your home for the holiday, do you ever think about saving the pumpkin seeds after the fun is over?

Consider roasting the seeds before freezing temperatures destroy the pumpkin fruit. Cut open the pumpkin and remove the seeds and stringy material. Seeds should be washed and dried and the "strings" discarded. Toss the seeds with a little oil before roasting.

Flavor can be enhanced by adding a sprinkling of salt to the oiled seeds. Seeds can then be spread on a cookie sheet and roasted for about 25 minutes at 325 degrees F. Times may vary depending on the size and moisture content of the seed. Seeds are done when they turn a golden brown. If seeds are not eaten immediately, store in a zip closure bag in the refrigerator. (Ward Upham)

Fair 2022


