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4-H Enrollment for the New Year

The 4-H year begins **October 1**! It is almost time to enroll for 4-H again!

You must enroll via 4-H Online, version 2. The link is https://v2.4honline.com/. New enrollments and re-enrollments begin **October 1** and need to be completed by **November 1**. This includes 4-H members and all volunteers. An enrollment guide with step by step instructions if needed. https://www.kansas4-h.org/resources/4-h-online/index.html

Please let us know if you have any questions as you complete the enrollment process. You can call our offices. Just a reminder that there is a \$15 enrollment fee.

Families should review years in project as they make project selections. This is the one feature that did not carry over from version one. Please enroll in any projects that you plan to take this year. The enrollment list is what is given to project leaders so they can communicate about upcoming meetings. The final drop add deadline for project selection is May 1.

Any Adult Who Wants to Volunteer

- Every community and project leader (Club and/or County) needs to have completed the volunteer screening process. You will need to update, or start a profile in 4-H Online if you haven't already done so. Once you update your profile it will automatically renew your VIP status every year. There is no longer a need to fill out the renewal form.
- The State is still requiring you to re-screen every 3 years after your initial year. You will complete the form online via 4-H Online--no more paper copies. We will submit the National Criminal Background Check for you as long as you have completed the Validity check in the past. A second background check is not required.
- You will only be required to complete the Orientation Training and Agent Interview if you have not completed the volunteer screening in the past. You will also need to complete the CBC (Validity) background check if you have not completed it in the past. The link will be provided to you.
- One other major change is that 'episodic' volunteers have been changed to 'Adult Helpers' instead. Now it is more defined, so hopefully it won't be as confusing as it was before.

The volunteer renewal process will begin October 1 along with 4-H enrollment and re-enrollment. If you completed it last year, it should remain as your permanent record in 4-H Online. It will just need to be edited each year going forward. You will receive an e-mail or letter if you need to complete anything other than updating the profile. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer please reach out to the extension office for details



2023 4-H Horse Project Changes

There will be some changes to the Horse Project this year. A full update was sent to all members that were enrolled in the horse project. Below are the updates on Horse ID's, Level Testing, and Equine Safety

Horse ownership: Each horse should be properly identified with the local Extension Office by June 1 of the current 4-H program year. Horses may be identified by a) completed Horse ID Certificate with all required signatures, or b) breed registration papers with horse ownership listed in the 4-H member's or a family member's name. "Family member" includes: immediate family: parent, stepparent, sibling, stepsibling, grandparent, or legal guardian. A copy of the 4-H Horse ID Certificate or the horse's registration papers must be submitted to the Extension Office by June 1. 4-H'ers exhibiting registered horses must present a copy of the registration papers or the 4-H Horse ID Certificate at check-in to the State Fair.

Level Testing: Beginning in 2023, the Kansas 4-H Horse Achievement Levels will no longer be required to participate at the State Fair 4-H Horse Show.

Equine Webinar Series- Horse Safety: All 4-H Horse Project Members are encouraged to participate in the live session or watch the recording of the "4-H Equine Webinar: Horse Safety" episode and quiz. Members who wish to exhibit at the Kansas State Fair 4-H Horse Show are required to watch the session and complete the quiz prior to entering the State Fair 4-H Horse Show


