Fair Pre-entry and Entries

Website: www.fairentry.com is open for entries!

The pre-entry deadline is July 3 and will automatically close at midnight. We are using the Fair Entry online system this year. There is a complete list of directions in the Fair Book (page 8) on this process. Please do not wait until the last minute to try to log-in the first time. An e-mail with detailing instructions was sent out. Look for it in your inbox.

The additional paperwork for Clothing, Buymanship, and Morris County Born Beef needs to be turned into our office on July 3 by 5 pm as well as entering the classes into the Fair Entry system.

The same applies for participation in the **swine or beef carcass contests**; please call our office to let us know you are entering these contests and also enter them in the Fair Entry system prior to Midnight **July 3**.

One of the advantages of using the Fair Entry online system is that you can also enter all other exhibits into the system in advance. All other exhibits (not requiring pre-entry) can be entered into the system between June 1 and July 25. If you choose to enter your other exhibits by July 25 at midnight your entry cards will be printed for you and you will NOT have to fill out green entry cards. If you choose not to enter the building exhibits into the Fair Entry system, there is no penalty - you will just need to fill out the green entry cards when you arrive.

Pre-entry for the Open Class Horse Show is encouraged, but not required.

When entering in Fair Entry, if a question does not apply, enter 'NA'.

If you have any questions, please be sure and ask.

Fair Survey

There will be a Fair survey for 4-H families to complete for the opportunity to give their feedback and suggestions for the fair. Look for the link that will be posted at the fair.

Fair Superintendents Meeting

There will be a Fair Superintendents meeting the night of fair set-up, **Wednesday**, **July 24** at 5:30 pm. If you are a superintendent, please plan to attend.

Snack Shack

The snack shack times for fair have been adjusted based on feedback. Please be sure to check out the times on the schedule. Once again the shifts will be beginning 30 minutes before the snack shack is scheduled to open. Club assignments are listed in the Fair Book on page 7. It is recommended that the snack shack have 6 people available to work to allow for sales, any food prep that needs to happen, table cleaning, and trash and bathroom care.

Check-in and Check-out

- Entries will not be accepted on Wednesday night following clean-up and set-up.
- For building exhibits, please be sure to sign up for judging times when you check your exhibit in Friday, July 26 5:00-8:00 pm - All livestock will be checked in and weighed.
- Saturday, July 27 7:30-9:30 am The ONLY exhibits allowed to be checked in at this time are foods, horticulture and floriculture because they are perishable.
- Release of exhibits will be at 8:00 p.m. this year. If exhibits are taken early, the fair board reserves the right to withhold ALL premium money from the exhibitor. Premium money includes ribbon premium, livestock sale premium, and foods auction premium. If you see another individual leaving before the 8:00 pm time, do not assume that it was approved. Please let a fair board member or extension agent know!

Premium Money and Auction Fees

- Ribbon premium amounts will be listed in the fair book to help with completion of records for record books.
- Money is held from checks of 4-H members participating in the premium auction to help with costs of the auction.
 - \Rightarrow For livestock, this has been \$10/animal and will continue at that rate.
 - \Rightarrow New this year, there will be \$5 withheld from each 4-H member participating in the 4-H Foods Auction.

Thank You Notes

The fair board works year round to gain sponsors of awards and trophies. Each year, Extension Agents and Fair Board are reminded how many thank you notes are not being sent. There will be a 'Thank You Note' booth at the fair to help 4-Her's get their thank you notes sent! If you have questions, please be sure to ask. The complete *Thank You Note* policies have been included in the Fair Book.

Agents' Tip of the Month

Preparing for the Fair --

Just a few thoughts to help as you get ready for the County Fair. Don't wait until the last minute to get ready!

- Take the time to read the general rules in the fair book now. Also read the rules for each project you are enrolled in.
- Put sticky notes for these project pages so they are easy to find. Highlight the classes that you will enroll in.
- Read to determine if you need to pre-enter your items by July 3rd.
- Think about what items you need to pick up for your project photo mat boards, ziploc bags, shavings, etc.
- Think about things you need to have ready with your item entry cards, building plans, recipe cards, stall cards, etc.
- Make a packing list so you don't forget something.
- Make plans to enter your exhibits with plenty of time on Friday, July 26th.
- The only exhibits that can be brought Saturday morning are Foods, Floriculture, Horticulture, and Open Class exhibits inside.

If you have questions, be sure to ask.

Proper animal health is one of the most important components in the beef industry. It is important that every producer is capable of observing when an animal is ill and how to appropriately administer different health products. The article, "Proper Handling and Administration of Cattle-Health Products", written by A.J. Tarpoff, DVM, MS, an Extension beef veterinarian, advises that the following recommendations may help cattle-health products work to their full potential. His suggestions, which are related for all products, are:

- Read the label and package insert
- Check and maintain proper temperature
- Label syringes to easily identify products
- Leave injectable in the original container
- Do not re-enter a bottle with a used needle
- Clean up at the end of the day
